GENIE has 45 partner Institutes for higher learning originating from 18 different European countries. GENIE is coordinated by Delft University of Technology (Marijke C. Dekker & Johan F.M. Molenbroek), Delft, Netherlands, and funded as a 3 year Thematic Network in the Socrates Program of the European Commission.

GENIE has facilitated introducing Gerontechnology in higher education by producing a web-based Learning Map for teachers and students. The Map includes topics on ageing, lifestyle, design, technology, methodology, demographics, and case studies of existing products and services.

tries and across boundaries. Following the 1st international conference in Eindhoven (1991) and the 2nd in Helsinki (1996), the ISG has taken the responsibility for a regular series of international Gerontechnology conferences: Munich (1999), Miami (2002), and probably Japan (2005).

- The promotion of cultural and scientific, international exchanges among engineers, researchers, designers, architects, and professionals in industry and in the field of comfort, welfare and health for the ageing and aged;

- The promotion of international experiments of an applied nature, in order to reinforce international potentialities in gerontechnology and to participate in their assessment;
- The promotion of international programmes in gerontechnology;
- The reinforcement of the participation of engineers, vocational professionals, administrators and industrial management in specific educational training courses in the domain of gerontechnology;
- The co-operation, closely with all similar international organisations and with all national bodies, governmental and nongovernmental, concerned with gerontechnology;
- Involving older citizens and their organizations in all relevant activities.

To reach these objectives, the following six standing committees have been established: Publication; Internal and External Communication; Education; Research, Design and Development, Industrial Relations; and Conferences. The committees formulate and implement working plans thus supporting the tasks of the Council of the Society. The primary objective of the Council itself is the further development and promotion of gerontechnology.

Society is open to membership by individuals

belonging to any kind of engineering, design, gerontological, scientific, industrial or administrative activities related to Gerontechnology. Membership fee includes a subscription to this journal.
