owner; however, a legal reclaim of the site would not stand much of a chance. The society's management decided therefore to purchase www.gerontechnology.info, and use this as her new internet base. Luckily, we were able to recapture the former site on October 7, 2003, as soon as it became free again. It will now serve as a forwarding site bringing you to the new ISG webaddress.

### **Future European Union Constitution**

The European Parliament passed a resolution to call for inclusion of a reference to the rights of disabled people (including older persons) in the Future European Union Constitution. At least the

following rights should be guaranteed: (i) Right to quality of life; (ii) Access to employment and equal pay for equal work or work of equal value; (iii) Access to education and vocational training; (iv) Right to inclusion (including the gradual removal of any barriers to accessing buildings, facilities, and public transport, and the right to live independently in the community); (v) Civil and political rights (including the promotion of the involvement in public life); (vi) Access to financial support; (vii) Access to healthcare; (viii) Access to culture and leisure; and (ix) Equality before the law and the right to justice.
